Fire Prevention at the 61st Gilwell Reunion

Each Contingent Must Provide the Following

- A designated Fire Prevention Person (to assume responsibilities)
- Two fire buckets filled with clean water
- Two 10lb. ABC-type Fire Extinguishers with proper inspection tag
- Propane cooking equipment (No liquid fuels)

Marquees

All canvas must meet "Standards for flame tests of flame resistant fabrics and films" All material **must show** the approved certification attached by the manufacturer. **These regulations are required to meet the Province of Ontario Building Codes and for the town of Milton Building Inspectors who issue our building permits.**

Propane in the Marquees

We can use propane in the Marquees for both lighting and cooking. No generators will be allowed. No Smoking will be allowed in the Marquees or in the Sleeping areas.

Propane Only

Propane is the only fuel allowed for use by contingents at the Gilwell Reunion for barbecues and stoves.

Empty Disposable Propane Cylinders

Disposable Propane Cylinders brought to Reunion and emptied must be taken home by the contingent and disposed of at home. Facilities are not available for their disposal at Blue Springs.

Ensure all propane tanks and devices are turned off each night.

Fire Lanes

Fire lanes will be set up in the sleeping areas and on the Main Fields. They must be kept open at all times!

Smoking

Smoking is allowed, but only in approved designated areas. Smokers are asked to "field strip" cigarettes, etc. Butt cans will be provided at the entrance to the rented kybos, Goat Hill, Ebor Park, and Blue Huron.

Inside all buildings are all no smoking areas

SLEEPING AREAS Absolutely NO SMOKING in sleeping areas

ABSOLUTELY NO COOKING OR HEATING EQUIPMENT ALLOWED in *sleeping* areas

FIRE PREVENTION CERTIFICATES

Each Contingent must have a Fire Certificate within three hours of set-up on the Main Field(s) or they must remove their canvas from the Main Field(s)

- Do not start cooking prior to fire inspection
- Fire Extinguishers must always be easily accessible and in full view
- Fire Buckets must be outside the canvas and kept full and clean (free of garbage) at all times
- Guy ropes must not block Fire Lanes
- Propane lighting allowed
- Groups must have garbage containers available

NO OPEN FIRES

Due to crowded conditions and to limit the risk of fire, no open fires are allowed during the Gilwell Reunion!

Showers

The Goat Hill outdoor showers and the toilet facilities inside the building are open.



Kevin Ward Reunion Guest Speaker

Toronto Police Service Constable- 22 Division & Humber Police Rover Crew Advisor

Little did Kevin Ward know that joining 54th Mississauga Cub Pack in 1993 would start an affiliation with Scouting that continues today. Kevin grew through Scouting's ranks which included roles with the newly established Regional Youth Forum and a 3-year term as DCC-Youth in Mississauga. Kevin recalls some amazing Scouting mentors and moments and is fascinated by how those people and experiences impacted his life and led to his choosing a career in the police service.



Kevin's relationship with Scouting was cemented when, during his second year as a Cub, he lost his grandfather to Alzheimers. Growing up in a single parent home with his Mom, Kevin's grandfather was an important male role model. Kevin was particularly close to his grandfather and spent many afternoons visiting with him after school since he only lived two houses away. Kevin remembers well that Akela (Donner Lenner, Central Escarpment Commission) and Bagheera (Phil Lacasse, now North Waterloo Committee Rep) came to the funeral in full uniform and stood with him in his time of grief. The support from these Scouting adults in his then young life left a mark on Kevin. He realized that Scouting was something big; that he would be able to look up to, and admire, these mentors.


Kevin continued to cross paths with many influential Scouters who shaped his early

adult life. Now retired Deputy Police Chief and Scouter Kim Derry helped Kevin establish the 22 Division Police Rover Crew in 2003. Now the largest crew in Canada (75 active members) and entering its 10th year, Kevin balances and manages his rewarding, and occasionally politically challenging, roles as a Police Constable and Rover Crew Advisor. The increased bureaucracy of working with two different organizations, the challenges presented by risk management and the shock that some among us have abused the trust of our youth and their parents, almost took the wind from his sails.

Recent personnel changes and some internal miscommunication at his work created a situation that caused Kevin to second guess his role with the Rover Crew. He was no longer having fun and it was causing him needless stress at work and at home. Thankfully, he never lost sight of the Scouting vision and reports that circumstances have evolved and life is good once again. Kevin shared his personal experiences to reinforce how important it is to balance the demands we placed on our volunteers and to ensure that we share responsibilities evenly. He stuck with the tasks at hand because of the people that stood by him over the years. "They never turned their backs on me and there was no way I was going to

turn my back on the members of my crew, Kevin declared. "YOU (my leaders) raised me better than that!"

In conclusion, Kevin observed that he had big shoes to fill as he made the transition from youth to leader and expressed hope that many more youth will benefit from their involvement with Scouting the way he did. "Just like the old saying goes, 'it takes a whole community to raise a child', the meaning of the theme "Many hands, one vision" reinforces that in a community there are many hands. We are the many hands of this organization and the youth that are entrusted to us are our vision! That is why we are here ... never forget that!"

Donna and Thomas Hazlett were to be Honourary Co-Camp Chiefs however due to illness Thomas was unable to attend, but he is still very much here in spirit.

Thomas was a Cub and Scout youth member. He returned to Scouting in 1985 as a Beaver Leader and has since been a Pack Leader, Scout Leader, Venturer Advisor, DAC Training of South Lake Simcoe, Group Committee Chair, Deputy Commissioner Shining Waters Council and DAC Group Support. He holds his Part II in Troop, Company and Service and he is a Level III trainer. Thomas is a recipient of the Medal of Merit and Centennial Medal.

During the past 23 years Donna has been a Group Chair, Venturer Advisor, Pathfinder Leader, Scout Leader, Sea Scout Leader,



ADC Company, DAC Program, Area Commissioner, DAC Membership Development and is currently ADAC Company / Crew.

She has her Woodbadge in Troop, Company, Crew and Service. She is also a Level III trainer and has trained on many courses.

Donna is the recipient of the Medal of Merit, Centennial Medal and Certificate of Meritorious Conduct.


