

David Gordon Bowes-Lyon August 17, 1949 to August 16, 2007

Commissioner of Owasco Area, after a tragic battle with lung cancer. Dave will be missed by all his friends in Scouting...at the Province, Region, & Area levels and in the Gilwell Clubs of Ontario & Quebec.

Dave began his scouting experiences as a youth in Quebec. After moving to Pickering he became a Beaver Leader with 7th Pickering in 1989. In 1990 he went on to Pack, as Akela. By 1992 Dave had joined the Service

Team of Owasco District and remained in Owasco on various roles.

After enjoying the experiences of training Dave took the position of DRC Volunteer Development for White Pine Region, and in 2001 returned to Owasco as President for the final year of Owasco as a District. He saw the importance in recognition for volunteers so in 2002 took the challenge of Chair of Honours and Awards for White Pine Council and still found time to sit as Area Commissioner for Owasco and a member of the Gilwell Committee. These last three positions he was holding until he was taken home.

The impact Dave had on the youth certainly showed when the four year old sister of one of his Cubs, came up to him and performed a perfect Grand Howl in the middle of Eatons' in the Pickering Mall. This brought tears to many eyes in the store and a precious memory for Dave.

Dave touched many lives, and Scouters and youth from Meetings, Camps, Training Courses, Workshops, Tasks Forces, Jamborees, and Gilwell Reunions will all have their own special memories of their times with Dave.



Changes to the method of voting for the Chair's Challenge!

It has been decided by the Ontario Gilwell Reunion Committee, that the method of voting for the Chair's Challenge will be changed from one (1) vote per attendee, to only two (2) votes per contingent present at the reunion. On the program within your registration packages, you can use the ballot there to cast an internal vote within your contingent to see who will receive your contingent's two (2) final votes. This program ballot is not part of your contingent's two (2) votes. You will notice that the colour of your ballot for the Chair's Challenge does not resemble that which is on your program. There should be no confusion. Each contingent gets two (2) only votes for the Chair's Challenge. That's it.





MISSISSAUGA: GONE HOME Irene Jobe and Phil Frost - two seasoned Scouters, Gilwellians, and friends.

Irene Jobe - Born in 1926, Irene was presented with the colours of her Girl Guide Company, the 22nd Toronto, in 1938 by her Majesty Queen Elizabeth (our sovereign's mother). She started her Scouting with 80th Toronto as Pack Leader, receiving her Gilwell Beads in 1963 in Burwash, Ontario. In 1981, Irene became a Mississauga Gilwellian and received her beads for Service Team. Affectionately known as the "Queen Mom", she served on several Jamborees and on the Honours and Awards Committee. Irene was a Scouter for 45 years.

Phil Frost-1926-2007. Born in England, Phil joined Cubs in the 1930's, served as a youth volunteer with the Civil Defense during World War II, then came to Canada in the early 1950's. He served as a volunteer at the World and Canadian Jamborees from 1955 to 1997. His Campfire Song Book is well used by many Scouters in Canada. For his volunteer work, mostly associated with Cubbing, Phil was awarded the Medal of Merit in 1980, the Silver Acorn in 1991, and the 125 year Canada Medal for Service in 1992.

He received a Mississsauga Recognition award this spring for 55 years of service to Scouting. Phil has asked that his ashes be spread around Mississauga Scouts Goodyear Memorial Scout Camp in Orangeville. So long. It's been good to know you.

I got to ride in one of the Search and Rescue jeeps. It was neat. We never would have found him in the dark if it hadn't been for the lightning.

Scoutmaster Webb got mad at Chad for going on a hike alone without telling anyone. Chad said he did tell him, but it was during the fire so he probably didn't hear him. Did you know that if you put gas on a fire, the gas can will blow up? The wet wood still didn't burn, but one of our tents did. Also some of our clothes, John is going to look weird until his hair grows back.

We will be home on Saturday if Scoutmaster Webb gets the car fixed. It wasn't his fault about the wreck. The brakes worked okay when we left. Scoutmaster Webb said that a car that old you have to expect something to break down; that's probably why he can't get insurance on it. We think it's a neat car. He doesn't care if we get it



dirty, and if it's hot, sometimes he lets us ride on the tailgate. It gets pretty hot with ten people in a car. He let us take turns riding in the trailer until the highway patrolman stopped and talked to us.

Scoutmaster Webb is a neat guy. Don't worry, he is a good driver. In fact, he is teaching Terry how to drive. But he only lets him drive on the mountain roads where there isn't any traffic. All we ever see up there are logging trucks.

This morning all of the guys were diving off the rocks and Scoutmaster Webb wouldn't let me because I can't swim sink because of his cast, so he let us take the canoe You can still see some of the trees under the water from isn't crabby like some scoutmasters. I have to go now. We are going into town to mail our letters and buy bullets. Don't worry about anything. We are fine.

"Make sure kids have fun. They are our future leaders," Jeff says. "Treat them with respect and they will respect you."

Jeff Smith, guest speaker

Jeff started out as a Cub in 1965. He left as a Scout at about 15, but came back in later with his son and now has been a Scouter for 22 years, leading Beavers, Scouts, Venturers and Rovers. He worked his way up Scouts Canada's hierarchy to a service scouter, to assistant district commissioner and to district commissioner.

Then Provincial APC Training, Volunteer Services, Special Events, Membership; Council Commissioner for Quebec, Program & Volunteer Services; and on National Operations & Advisory Committee. Currently Jeff is Deputy Executive Commissioner for Central Canada.

Highlights of his speech:

Jeff lives in Quebec, and the English translation of what Quebec scouters do, is to "animate the program". He reiterated what B-P once said about our roles with the youth we serve: "We teach, we train and we let them lead." We are encouraged to live by that assertion.

Jeff asked all participants to stand up, take one step to our left and with our right hand, reach out and touch the one beside us. That way no one here can ever say that they weren't "uplifted, moved and touched" by someone from National.

Congratulations were extended to those councils across Canada that have attained 100% membership growth. In fact, two councils exceeded their 100% growth goals. Greater Toronto Council made 109% and Pacific Coast Council made 107%.


