
Saturday Activities

Drinking Water at Blue Springs Scout Reserve as of September 2015

Water sample(s) collected from the *Blue Springs Scout Reserve* identified the sodium level in the water is greater than the Ontario Drinking Water Quality Standards of 20mg/L. Sodium levels that exceed 20mg/L are reported to the Halton Region Health Department. The average intake of sodium from water is only a small fraction of that consumed in a normal diet. A maximum acceptable concentration for sodium in drinking water has, therefore, not been specified.

What these results mean for you:

If you do not have any health problems that could be affected by sodium intake, these results of elevated levels of sodium are not a health concern. You can continue to drink this tap water.

If you have been advised to monitor your sodium intake or are on a sodium-reduced diet due to a chronic illness such as high blood pressure or congestive heart failure, you should discuss drinking this water with your physician. If you consume three or more litres of this water each day, you should discuss these results with your physician.

In closing, this water is safe to drink and the sodium is unlikely to cause health concerns for the majority of people consuming the water. However, if you do have a health concern, please see your physician.

Any health concerns you may have with respect to sodium content in your water (e.g. sodium restricted diet) should be directed to a physician. Please do not drink the water. Use bottled water.
